Roman  
 Italic  
 Serif  
 Sans Serif

Letters which stand up straight are called Roman, and those that slope forward are called Italic. Almost all type can be categorized into two basic kinds of typeface - Serif and Sans Serif. The serif letter form is distinguished by a short stroke that projects from the ends of the character. Those letter forms without the short stroke are known as Sans Serif, from the French word sans, meaning without.
